State of Digital Sovereignty in the Italian PA

June 2026 — National Digital Sovereignty Observatory · MxMap.it data on IndicePA

In summary

We analysed 22,987 bodies of the Italian Public Administration registered in IndicePA. For each one we identified the email provider and the jurisdiction to which it is subject. **46.1%** of bodies rely on providers subject to non-EU jurisdiction (e.g. the CLOUD Act), against **51.2%** on Italian providers.

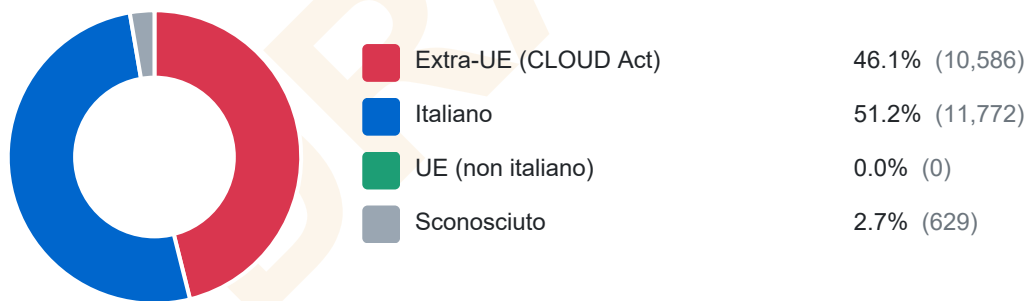
MICROSOFT'S OWN ADMISSION

“No, I cannot guarantee it.”

Microsoft France's Director of Public and Legal Affairs, asked at a hearing whether he could guarantee that European citizens' data would never be transferred to the US government under a CLOUD Act order — without the national authorities' agreement. Microsoft itself admits it cannot rule out the transfer of European data to US authorities.

The snapshot: provider sovereignty

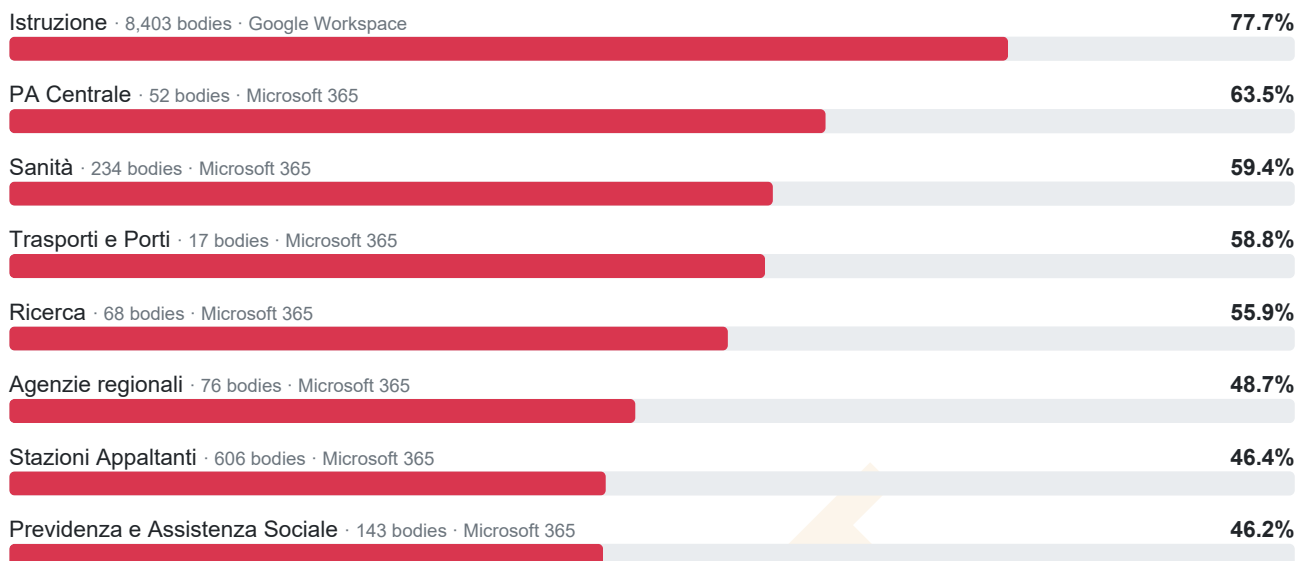


Most widespread providers

The data derive from the analysis of the DNS records of PA domains (IndicePA): for each body we identify the email provider and the jurisdiction. Raw data from MxMap.it, open and reproducible methodology, CC BY-SA 4.0 licence.
